Black Canyon takes its name from the malpais (Spanish: "bad land," i.e. volcanic) formation of its walls which have a black appearance. The canyon was used by stage drivers and freighters, since the road along its bottom connected military forts in the early days. The Black Canyon highway follows the old road, but it cut through the high sides of the canyon. At points, one can look down to the canyon floor and see signs of the old trail. The first post office was established as Canon in 1894 and discontinued in 1906. The current post office was established in 1955 as Black Canyon. Black Canyon City is located on the Black Canyon Highway between Phoenix and Flagstaff.

Scenic Attractions

Black Canyon City's location is situated in a valley in the Bradshaw Mountain foothills. The valley was carved out by two major rivers, the Agua Fria and Black Canyon. Jack Swillings built his home in 1871. At one time, it served as a stage coach station and is the oldest standing dwelling in the community. A metal sculpture, built by late resident Will Smith, is in front of the Black Canyon City Community Library. The sculpture is of a story teller telling of Indian lore. The 1910 stage coach station is still in operation selling antiques, hunting and fishing licenses. High Desert Park is a 75-acre park with hiking trails and picnic benches.
